With their strong work ethic and consistent commitment to learning in the classroom and on the court, these players, under the guidance of Coach Brendan Garret and his staff of coaches, will compete with the best in Ventura County and opponents in the CIF Southern Section. Camarillo Scorpion Basketball competes in the Coastal Canyon League against Moorpark, Oak Park, Simi Valley, and Royal.

Varsity Head Coach

Brendan Garrett



Brendan Garrett was hired as the Head Boys' Basketball Coach at Adolfo Camarillo High School on May 31st, 2019. Coach Garrett commented, "I am absolutely thrilled to be named the head coach at Camarillo. It is a program and school with a lot of culture and tradition, an awesome athletic director (Mary Perez), and a supportive administration. I am excited to get going, and I am looking forward to serving our campus, community, and most importantly, our student-athletes." Last year's team at Camarillo High School made school history by making it to the State quarter finals (Southern California regional semi-final). It was the program's first time ever qualifying for the state tournament, and the furthest they have ever made it. They also made the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) Southern Section's Division 3-AA semi-finals. During the past four seasons, Camarillo has made the playoffs each year, extending the streak to 14 straight postseason appearances. The Scorpions were also the Academic Team Champions for the CIF-SS, for having the highest team grade point average, and were invited down to Angel Stadium to be honored on the field prior to an Angels baseball game. Last season, the Scorpions lost to one of the Coastal Canyon League co-champions by three points, and the other co-champion by four points. Seven points stood in the way of a league title (or at least a share of it). The Scorpions also had Chase Aronowitz, one of the best three-point shooters in the state and the nation last season. He finished 9th in the nation, 2nd in the state, shattered the Ventura County record by over 40, and obliterated the school record in makes, with 144. He also broke the school record for most makes in a game, with 9, in our CIF-SS quarterfinal win. The Scorpions will be without returning starter and one of County's leading rebounders this year, Jack Bannon, who suffered a knee injury in the off-season. Regarding the upcoming season, Coach Garrett says, "We have a good core group returning from a historical postseason run last year. We have great kids, from great families, who are tough, smart, and allow us to coach them hard. We always believe we have a chance if we continue to have student-athletes like this." The Scorpions have had five players move on to play in college, and one NCAA division one team manager (UNLV), in the last four seasons (Carter Alexander, Pat Bowman, Damian Ruiz, Jordan Torres, Isaac Means, & Chase Aronowitz). Coach Garrett also teaches on campus in the Social Science and AVID departments. Prior to this, Coach Garrett was the top assistant for California Lutheran University. He spent 5 seasons there (2012-2017), and helped the program gain a lot of success. They got back to being above a .500 winning percentage in his first year. CLU played for a conference championship in his second year and won the conference (SCIAC) in 2015. CLU went 20-7 in 2016-17 and played for another conference championship. During the 2016-17 season, CLU had the best start of the season since the 1992-93 season (7-0 record). Coach Garrett also was responsible for the recruitment of starting point-guard, Caleb Richey, who was the SCIAC Newcomer of the Year, and selected First Team All SCIAC. Caleb was also ranked #1 in the country in assist-to-turnover ratio, and now holds the single-season assist record. Coach Garrett also assisted in the development and recruitment of 1st Team All SCIAC wing, Wolfgang Wood, who is the current coach for St. Bonaventure high school. He also was responsible for the recruitment of 2-time all-conference, all-region player, and NABC All-American, Arik Smith, who is currently playing in one of the top professional leagues in Europe. He was also responsible for the recruitment of guard Adrian Francis, who was a leader or top 3 on our team in most statistical categories before his injury. Coach Garrett was also responsible for the recruitment of Kyle Ferreira (NCAA D1 transfer from Cal State Univ. Bakersfield), who shot over 40% from the three-point line for the season, and over 50% for most of conference play. Brendan Garrett came back to CLU after serving as the Head Boys' Basketball Coach at Hueneme High School in Oxnard, CA from 2008-12. There, he took over a program that had just three wins in the previous season. In his 2nd season, not only did the team almost quadruple the win total from his first season, but he also guided them back to the CIF playoffs for the first time in four seasons. He would also go on to guide them back to the CIF playoffs in his final season. While there, Coach Garrett was responsible for the development of one all-Ventura County player, 6 all-Pacific View League (PVL) players, and 7 all-PVL honorable-mention players. He also helped one player to finish the 2008-09 season ranked in the top 100 in the nation for blocks (per maxpreps.com), and another player to be ranked first in PVL and second in Ventura County for rebounding in 2011-12. Coach Garrett was also hard at work off the court by drastically increasing the fundraising amount by almost six times in his first year. Hueneme also saw an increase in the program's overall grade-point average, no academic ineligibility at the varsity level, and a 100% graduation rate during Garrett's tenure. Coach Garrett also led the direction of the summer youth basketball camps, which saw an increase in enrollment from 18 to over 160 kids during his time.

Prior to that, Coach Garrett was hired as the top assistant coach at Nebraska Wesleyan University in the city of Lincoln. He was one of the youngest in the nation to hold this position at the college level, at the time. There, his duties included recruiting coordinator; development of perimeter players (where he helped develop one all-conference guard); assisted with designing off-season skill development workouts and strength & conditioning workouts; director of camps (planning, marketing, registering, & teaching/coaching); assisted with fundraising; in-charge of scouting opponents; assisted with game scheduling; academic liaison; alumni development; and team equipment organization & coordination of student-managers. Before that, Coach Garrett was invited to serve as the Graduate Assistant Coach at CLU once he was done playing. While there, Coach Garrett was selected as a National Camp Counselor of the Year by Camp Business magazine in 2004, for his work done for the famous, summer Lu Dog Basketball Camps at CLU. While completing his graduate work, he assisted with all aspects of the program, including on the floor coaching; film exchange; scouting; film breakdowns; recruiting; camps; equipment management; & study hall. The Kingsmen led the nation for NCAA Division 3 in team field goal percentage in 2004-05. Coach Garrett played at California Lutheran University from 1999-2003. While there, he played for Hall of Fame Coach Rich Rider's first Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SCIAC) championship team that also played in the national tournament in 2001. During his four years, the team's overall record was 69-31 and 41-14 (0.732%) in conference. In 2001-02, the Kingsmen team won 20 games, were ranked in the top 10 in the west region and got votes for top 25 in the country on D3hoops.com. In his senior year, he was voted the team's Hard Hat Award winner, which is given to the player with the best work ethic. Coach Garrett completed his bachelor's degree in social science in 2003, received his California single-subject teaching credential in 2006, and his master's degree in education in 2007. During his prep career, Coach Garrett was a four-year varsity letterman. He played his senior high school season at Silverado High School (Victorville, CA). Coach Garrett was ranked in the top 25 in the Southern Section for assists and free-throw percentage. He was also listed on SoCal Hoops as a "best of the rest" point-guard on the west coast. Coach Garrett served as a team captain, was the Coach's Award winner, and was all-High Desert honorable mention for a team that made the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) Southern Section Division 1-AA playoffs. He also set the record for most assists in a season. His coach there was Kurt Herbst, who is a former assistant coach to Greg Popovich (current San Antonio Spurs Head Coach). Prior to that, Coach Garrett played 3 years at Hueneme High School in Oxnard, where he was born and raised. There he was a team captain and played varsity as a freshman. His coach there was longtime college coach Tom McCollum, who also did some scouting work for the Los Angeles Lakers and the Portland Trailblazers in the NBA. Coach Garrett is married to Jennifer (Gilbertson), and they have two sons. Brendan Jr. (11), and Jordan (6). They reside in Camarillo. Jennifer played basketball for powerhouse program, Meadowdale High School, in the greater Seattle area (WA), and she was an MVP her freshman year.

Michael Keddington

Coach Michael Keddington is entering his fifth season as Assistant Varsity Coach at ACHS. Prior to joining the Scorpion program, Coach Keddington was the Head Varsity Coach at Channel Islands High School (2010-2014). From 2008-2010, Michael was the Hueneme High School Assistant Varsity and Head FS Coach. Keddington also has over five years' experience coaching with the Branch West Basketball program. Coach Keddington takes extraordinary pride in working with and developing the players at the Varsity level.

Michael is a product of OUHSD having graduated from Channel Islands High School in 2000 and then continuing his education and playing career at Grossmont College (2000-2002) and the University of Alaska Anchorage (2002-2006). Coach Keddington has also taught at Hueneme High School, Channel Islands High School, and Pacifica High School before joining the staff at ACHS in 2019.

Keddington resides in Camarillo and has a son, Dillon (8) who attends Tierra Linda Elementary School.

Coach Keddington is looking forward to the 2023-2024 season and would like to thank everyone for their support of the program.

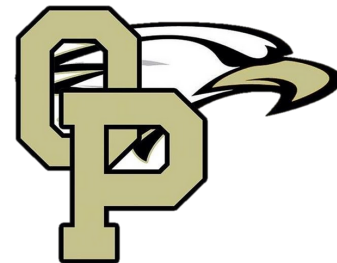

BOYS' BASKETBALL TIME CAPSULE

1956-57:

JV only in school's first year open, no gym, only Freshman and Sophomores. Coach Alec Tomlinson named new coach. Practices were on outside courts.

1957-1960:

Coach Tomlinson led the Scorpions in their new adventure and guided them through the challenging Frontier League with Hart and Fillmore as the dominate teams. Practices on the cement courts next to the boy's locker room - home games at Oxnard High - gym completed at the end of 1959. First game in new gym vs Hart.

1960-1965:

Coach Dunn coached Camarillo into the transition of the large school league called the Channel with county powers Ventura and Santa Barbara. The Scorpions struggled to find their footing. Some really lean years relative to wins.

1965-1968:

Camarillo continued to struggle in the Channel League with new coach Riley, but in 1967 the Scorps ended 13-12 overall and started the climb. Camarillo started getting fan support.

1968-1975:

The hiring of Coach John McMullen changed everything. He took a band of brothers in his first season and became competitive in the Channel League, Three years later in the newly formed Marmonte League Coach McMullen took the Scorpions into the playoffs for the first time after winning the league and then went all the way defeating the number one seed West Covina along the way to the LA Sports Arena where Camarillo beat El Modena of Orange 73-71 in OT to win the school's very first CIF Championship in any sport - this one the 3A boys division. That team was a sparkling 27-3. The city of Camarillo was on fire with Scorpion fever, if you didn't arrive to the JV game you were unable to get into the gym. New intense rivalries developed with Newbury Park and Oxnard that year that continued into the 70's.

1975-1980:

Coach McMullen's departure to Santa Monica City College was a blow to the program but Coach John Cummings took the Scorpions to a #1 ranking and its first undefeated league season at 10-0 in the Marmonte. ACHS was stunned in the second round and finished 24-3. After that Camarillo basketball went into a dark period of tough losses and then a return to the Channel League in 1978 where San Marcos dominated everyone.

1980-1990:

With the exception of 1987 when new coach John Harbour took a year off and Coach Greg Ropes took the team, John Harbour rocked Camarillo's basketball world in the 80's bringing fans back produced great teams that made the Scorpion nation proud once again. His tough coaching style was known throughout the county as well as his defensive minded teams (before the shot clock). He won 4 Marmonte League titles battling new basketball rival Simi Valley and was able to coach his own son David who broke most Scorpion records.

1990-2010:

After Coach Harbour retired Mike Prewitt, former Channel Islands head coach took the reins in a 19-year career at Camarillo where he won more games than any other coach. Prewitt's teams were well known for class, hard work, determination in the rugged Marmonte and later the newly formed Pacific View Leagues. In 2007 Camarillo went to the semifinals of the CIF playoffs for the first time since the 72 championship. The Scorps lost a hard-fought game at Corona Centennial with a horde of Camarillo fans packing the visiting gym. Coach Prewitt battled Thousand Oaks and then later Oxnard in the Pacific View League. Coach Prewitt and his longtime assistant Bill Dowden made Camarillo a respected and fun place to play basketball in Ventura County.

2010-2014:

Camarillo alum and Frosh coach Allan Sadowsky was given the opportunity to raise the bar for Scorpion basketball and he did just that winning the Pacific View League twice and finishing no lower than second and into the playoffs each season. Camarillo finally broke Oxnard's stranglehold on the PVL - Camarillo also battled Rio Mesa in league as well. Coach Sadowsky and Coach Ruffanelli at Rio started the "Ball it up for Cancer" program raising thousands of dollars for cancer programs in the county. Coach Sadowsky also hosted an alumni game and recognized the CIF Championship team in front of the Scorpion fans - many of the former players and coach McMullen showed up for the weekend.

2014-2019:

One of the most exciting and wide-open games in Camarillo history started day one with Coach Michealtore Smith. With the help of Division I future UCLA and Miami Heat star Jaime Jaquez Jr, Camarillo scored more points in the 4 years with Coach Smith than any time in history. The team lost a heartbreak in Jaquez's final season at Rancho Cucamonga with less than a second left on a three-point half-court shot to end the game with a final score of 86-83. Some incredible high scoring games against Hart, Heritage Christian and a Coastal Canyon League Title that stopped the Oak Park streak marked that era. Coach Smith believed in playing the best teams he could find so he scheduled top national teams in a Las Vegas Tourney and at Orange Coast College he scheduled top ranked Mater Dei and even after trailing by 14 in the second half the Scorpions chipped away and beat the Monarchs by 5. The LA Times called it "the biggest non-league upset this side of the 405 in CIF history". It's an era that won't soon be forgotten.

2019 – present:

Coach Brendan Garrett inherited a tough situation with the graduation of Jaime Jaquez and his high scoring teammates. Coach Garrett came to Camarillo with a wealth of coaching experience at Hueneme High and Cal Lutheran University. He continues to build the program from the youth of our community on up. He has assembled an outstanding staff and survived the shortened Pandemic season that was a setback for everyone. In 2020-21 he took the Scorpions to the second round CIF and ended the year 17-13. The future is bright for the Blue and Silver Scorpions - we look for great things this season and beyond. Coach Garrett has continued the streak of 13 straight years of playoff eligibility for the team. 2022-23 marked a huge turn around as the team went 21-14 making the semifinals against La Serna in a packed Scorpion gym and the game came down to the wire with Chase Aronowitz blazing the state record for 3 pointers in a season (144). Camarillo entered the state playoffs for the first time and surprised San Diego as well as Oakwood only to fall the longtime rival Buena in the Quarterfinals of the state playoffs in the Bulldog gym. What an amazing playoff run with 5 playoff wins. A core of players return for the 23-24 season.

- Lifetime Scorpions have 868 wins and 673 losses = 56.3% winning percentage since 1958 = 13.5 wins per season and 10.50 losses per season average.
